**Subject: Installation Problems** 

I have many times to get GNU Backgammon downloaded and running. I get the same problems every time. I'm running Win XP SP. I have tried IE and Firefox, which I generally use. I get the same result with either. I just uninstalled the previous installation and downloaded from <a href="http://www.gnubg.org/index.php?itemid=21">http://www.gnubg.org/index.php?itemid=21</a>. It seemed to come fine. I did not get an offer for bear-off libraries, except once.

I double- clicked: and appeared to install the program. It did mention that I already had a folder named gnubg, and asked if I wanted to install to it anyway. I said OK. Next time I'll uninstall, delete (again) anything that relates to GNU (including that folder). I don't think that is the problem.




I get the shortcut:

When I click it to open the program I get this message:




If I cancel the above (twice), the program opens and looks like this:




If I click on 'File' 'New' I get:




'GNU Backgammon vs. Human' or 'Keep Current Settings' makes no difference. I leave the 'Settings' as:



I set 'game options' for automatic rolls:



I take it as a bad sign that I do not have the toolbar shown on the gnu website which includes a 'roll' button. This one:



If the bot wins the opening roll, it plays it. I can click for a roll, get it, and play it. That's the end. The bot does not play.



Clicking (left or right) in the open areas (left or right) has no effect. Ctl-r does nothing. 'Roll' in the command window does nothing. I have uninstalled and redownloaded and re-installed. I have tried every rollover I have. I have been all through options many times. You may doubt me, but I am not a moron. Let's start with this – how can I get that toolbar (above), as shown on the website.
